Dear Mrs. Meagher:

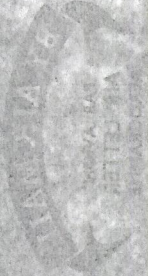
Please forgive the delay in answering your kind note about the New Yorker article. I left for Africa shortly before the article came out, and the mail only recently caught up with me.

Please forgive the delay in answering your kind note about the new letter article. I felt for a moment about the article came out, and she will only recently contact me with me.

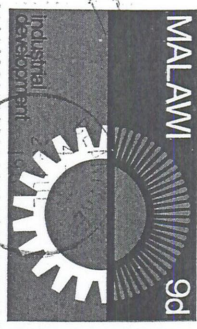
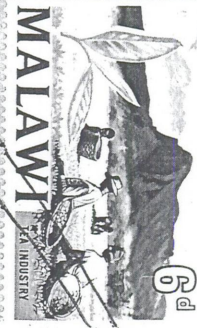
