Dear Mr. Emerson,

Your publication in recent issues of the condensation of Six Seconds in Dallas and the David Wise article on the secret documents in the National Archives, and especially the forthright editorial which accompanied Tink Thompson's SSD, are very heartening. The pusillanimity of the major periodicals on this issue is disappointing and a matter that those publications will, I think, come to regret bitterly. The Saturday Evening Post will, I hope, continue to maintain its leadership on the question of the Warren Report, undismayed by the crackpots and charlatans whose mischief has confused this subject, among others, and handicapped serious scholarship.

In the light of your publication of the Wise article and the additional illumination it provided of the Warren Commission's procedures and methodology, I am submitting a piece on the aborted "Texas Court of Inquiry" and the relationship of Texas officials with the Warren Commission's work. It sheds further light on the initial stages of the investigation, I think, and on the subsequent conduct of the inquiry.

Please let me know if it has any interest for SEP, as I should like to submit it elsewhere if you cannot use it. Tink Thompson or Don Preston can tell you about my work on the Warren Report, although the enclosed ms. has now been read by them (or anyone else).
