Dear Mr. Freed,

The news of your film production on the Oswald case is very interesting and gratifying, for such a film could make a special contribution to public knowledge and understanding of a highly complicated triple homicide mystery. I foresee some serious problems in transposing the unchallenged testimony as it was elicited by the Warren Commission into an adversary context; but no doubt you and your associates are already aware of many of obstacles and have perhaps already found ways to surmount them.

You may be sure that I will readily cooperate with you, to the extent that I can be of assistance and within the limits of available time. The upsurge of public interest in the Warren Report has placed many new demands on all the researchers; and most of us have full-time jobs unrelated to the case, so that we can support our "habit" of independent investigation into the inexhaustible puzzles and enigmas which characterize the subject, as it has emerged from the kitchens of the Commission.

Do please let me know in more detail just what you have in mind. Incidentally, several of the most respected and responsible of the researchers on the case live in the Los Angeles area, as you may know already. Their commitment to the search for the truth is such that I feel sure that they would also offer every possible cooperation to any project which has the objective of establishing the facts and rectifying injustice.
