Cornally and Dr. Gregory agreed that Cornally's position at the time he was struck by bullet was with "right wrist on left leg, with little finger an inch or two from knee."

(Therefore Cornally could not have received his wounds as long as his right wrist was in view to Zapruder)

V5-p171

Frazier testifies that the only time that Cornally was in position to have received his wounds from that sixth floor window was between frame 207 and 225. (Specific frames questioned 231? - 235? 240? - 249? - 255? - All numbered 10)

Page 45 - Frame 230 (Enlarged)

(Caption) "Still calm five frames and, 27 seconds later, Cornally sits in front of the stricken President with the fingers of his right hand - the one supposedly shattered at the wrist one-third second or more before - gripping the brim of his hat."

Pages 41-42 - Frames 229-230-231-232-233 (Small)

and

Life 10/2/64

Page 43 - Frame 232 (Enlarged)

All frames 229 through 233 show Cornally in some position - with his right hand gripping the brim of his hat.

(Therefore Cornally could not have been shot in any of these frames because his <sup>uninjured</sup> right wrist was in view to Zapruder and Frazier said he was ~~not in position and~~ could not have received his wounds from that sixth floor window after frame 225 and specifically not in frames 231 and frame 235.) (Cornally says he was shot at frames 234-235 - Life pg 43) says "In 236 his mouth flies open and he starts to twist around toward his right. In 238 his right shoulder suddenly buckles as he sways toward the limousine door."

Therefore, by their own expert's testimony, and by  
Connally's own testimony, and by the X-ray film,  
showing that Connally was hit with his right wrist  
in sight from Frames 229 through 233 - this proves  
that Connally was not only hit by a separate bullet  
but the bullet that hit him had to have come from  
another direction and not from that sixth floor window  
of the book depository.
