Harold Weisberg; researcher, author of Whitewash and Frameup, who  
recently filed suit against the Federal Government under the Freedom  
of Information Act and obtained the release of classified material  
relating to the JFK assassination,

Dr. Cyril Wecht; noted forensic expert, Chief Coroner of Allegheny  
Co., Pa., who in 1969 was permitted to examine the classified JFK  
autopsy records in the National Archives and also assisted in the autopsy  
examination of Robert Kennedy,

Ralph Schoenman; University Professor and researcher who, with  
Dick Gregory, recently testified before the Rockefeller Committee regarding  
the JFK assassination,

James Lesar; attorney for James Earl Ray, who worked with Harold  
Weisberg on the Freedom of Information lawsuit,

John Marks; former intelligence officer, co-author of The CIA  
and the Cult of Intelligence,

Bob Richter; worked on CBS investigation of JFK assassination, and

Penn Jones, Jr.; Texas newspaper publisher and author of Forgive  
My Grief.

Conference participants will discuss old and new evidence in the  
deaths of John and Robert Kennedy and Martin Luther King. Researchers  
and Experts will discuss new forensic and photographic evidence and newly  
declassified documents of the Warren Commission.
