On Saturday, June 7th the newly formed Assassination Information Committee will present filmed evidence that John F. Kennedy's assassination was not the work of one "lone nut".

Robert Groden and Richard Sprague, two of the foremost experts on photographic evidence concerning the JFK assassination, will present a film and slides analyzing that evidence. There will be two complete presentations at 1:00 PM and 7:30 PM at the Washington Square Methodist Church, 133 W. 4 St (between 6th Ave. & MacDougal). Robert Groden, who has recently appeared on nationwide TV (including Geraldo Rivera's "AM America" & Tom Snyder's "Tomorrow Show"), has spent nine years analyzing the Zapruder film with the latest optical techniques. After enlarging each frame, he has found hidden clues which clearly reveal that the fatal shot was not fired from the Texas School Book Depository. The film is not pleasant, but it carries shattering implications for America. It may be the single most influential film in history.

Richard Sprague, owner of the most extensive collection of assassination-related photographs, is considered by many to be the photographic expert on the JFK assassination. He, too, has studied the evidence in minute detail over the last decade. He also worked with Jim Garrison, the former New Orleans DA on the Clay Shaw trial. He was one of the founders of the Boston-based Assassination Information Bureau, and has been instrumental in reviving public interest in the assassination.

The Assassination Information Committee is a group of New York area residents who came together following a three-day conference on assassinations held at N.Y.U. Law School in April. They have organized to disseminate facts, to increase public awareness of the matter, and to encourage Congress to hold a thorough and open investigation of political assassinations in America. Meetings are held every Friday evening at 8 PM at Loeb Student Center, N.Y.U..
