Dear Sylvia,

The CCI has been making real progress during the past few months. As we get closer, day by day, to a possible break through I think of you and the other few responsible voices that were heard so long ago.

More than sixty members of Congress have now sponsored resolutions calling for a congressional investigation, the FBI oversight committee (a sub-committee of the House Judiciary Committee) may hold hearings on a relevant bill (FBI supression of relevant evidence) in the near future and we are organizing congressional district support through lectures, conferences and organizations in a number of key states.

I enclose a brochure that begins to describe us; written only a few months ago it is already badly out of date. We'll send you our newsletter, statement of principles and organizing kit for your information when that material is printed.

We would be delighted if you wanted to join us in any way you wish—as a member of the Executive Committee, as someone who writes an article for the newsletter (on any relevant subject you wish) or in any other way. We are, all of us, careful, non-speculative and concerned with making only those statements that can be verified.

Our Connecticut CCI under the leadership of a professor at the University of Hartford is busy organizing, petitioning, arranging our first CCI conference, October 10-12 at Hartford, and lithographing out of print relevant material. Would you like your book re-published in a very limited uncovered editionation those who have asked for it over the last years? If so they would be pleased to do it and sell it for cost with some modest royalty to the author.

I hope you are well and I hope as well that you find some way that is comfortable for you to join us.
