With the passage of time I find myself pondering with amazement and bafflement the total lack of interest in the Siebert-O'Neill receipt for a "missile removed by Dr. Humes." I can't put it out of my mind.

As it stands, it blows away the autopsy, convicts S-O of writing a lying report, makes Necht-Thompson-Lattimer et al expose, and, in line, together with the Z film destroys the Commission's case all by itself.

If it is false the implications are also astounding, for it argues the uncovered works of a mysterious agency directed against

the official government account of the assassination.

It is a mystery. Yet no one has remarked on its possible importance. My attempt to provoke discussion has failed completely, which is another mystery.

But now you have a good opportunity to raise the question of the significance of this single piece of paper and of this phantasmal missile, the dialectic counterpart of the "magic" bullet, in connection with the release of your book. Surely the "release for research" of important documents — the two death certificates and the S-O receipt — are important to the post-assassination

history of the cover-up of a conspiracy  
to remove the head of state, don't you  
think? Perhaps in preparing your  
updating introduction you would consider  
writing to Humes? Possibly, even visit  
him in Detroit? If you were to do that  
I'd love to go along.

I have many glorious memories of days  
in Detroit during the great auto strikes of 1936  
and padones of the Ford strike in 1941. And  
I haven't been to Detroit since.

Talking with Humes should be very interesting.
