Page 42

Leon Jaworski was not on the team of lawyers assembled by Rankin. He was one of several lawyers designated by the Attorney General of Texas to monitor the interests of the State of Texas by serving as an observer at the proceedings of the Warren Commission.

Page 33

It was Connally's right wrist that was smashed, not his left wrist.

Page 66

The girl who hanged herself in the jail cell was Betty MacDonald (although she may have used the name "Nancy Jane Mooney" as a stage name).

Page 75

At bottom of page: The company that manufactured the ammunition wrote to me (Sylvia Meagher), not to the Warren Commission, stating that the reliability of such ammunition would be questionable today.

Page 77

In the last paragraph: Weitzman confirmed his identification in a signed affidavit the next day (not "that day") but I am not aware of any other police officer doing the same.

Page 89

Strictly speaking, Lattimer was not "selected by the government" but by a representative of the Kennedy family.

Page 134

At the bottom of the page: the photograph was in fact taken in Dallas and not in Irving.

Page 199

As I recall the newspaper story, it was the Miami police and not the Secret Service that insisted that the motorcade be cancelled and the helicopter be used. On the last line, add after the word "possibility" the words "of an Oswald imposter", to make your meaning clear.
