Dear Ms Meagher,

I wonder if you would mind assisting us in a great venture? I represent a newly formed group called the "Coalition for Action". Our steering committee consists of a law student, a writer, a high school student, and a housewife. In the last few months we have attended a number of conferences and watched a great many television shows dealing with the assassination of John F. Kennedy. These varying accounts have left us angry and frustrated. We feel that the time has come for a united effort to reopen the investigation into the death of President Kennedy, and to this end, we are in the process of organizing a series of conferences for early next year. We feel that too often researchers spend their valuable time "splitting hairs" on the details of the assassination and unfortunately the resulting feuds and accusations support this belief.

Basically we all want the same thing — the truth — and we think that the time is right to put aside our differences and

join together as a single unit
with a single objective: the
reopening of the investigation.
