Dear Mr. Gould,

On reflection, it seemed to me that I should document more fully my criticisms of Louis Nizer's expertise with respect to the Warren Report and the Hearings and Exhibits than I did in my letter to you yesterday.

I have therefore transcribed the tape recording of his remarks on the Barry Gray show, to which you referred in your column yesterday, and enclose the transcript herewith. I have also prepared an analysis of the misstatements of fact found in the transcript, which do a disservice to those members of the listening public who may assume that Nizer speaks with authority on this subject. The analysis is enclosed also.

May I hope that you will be good enough to read those enclosures with care and in an impartial spirit, and then to invite Mr. Nizer to reply, if he can refute any assertions of fact made in challenging his statements? If he cannot or will not, I hope that your sense of fairness will lead you to use your next opportunity to address your readers anew on the subject of Nizer's competence to defend the Warren Report.
