Dear Sylvia,

I was delighted to receive your letter of February 8th and to hear that you think the slides are important.

I sent slide sets out to other critics that I correspond with for the purpose of getting feedback. Most of these people give public lectures and I asked them to get expert endorsement or hostile criticisms for me (Gary Schoener, Gary Murr, Dick Sprague, and Dr. George Abbott of San Diego AIC). So far, I have only heard good things but I know these critics have the same bias I have.

Roy Watson is a professional photographer of 30 years, with war-time experience with Lockheed Aircraft Company in their photo department. Roy has played devils advocate with me on this and was a Commission backer until I showed him the overlays.

I am what is called an art director (advertising jargon) or commercial artist of some 20 years experience in layout, illustration and perspective. And in the course of my work, I have done many such composites for advertising illustrations. I work with photographers constantly and understand film and what you can do or not do with it. I also do photo retouching, but am not by profession an airbrush specialist. However, here again, I work with photo retouchers and constantly give them assignments and approve their work.

As you can see by these PROBE articles, I am not a professional writer. PROBE editor Perry Adams is responsible for making sense out of this story.

Your idea about a presentation in a mass circulation magazine is a good one and I would be grateful if you could arrange anything here. I don't have any contacts in this area and thought that if I mailed a set of slides to some Eastern editor it would be a waste of time since it is important that these slides be presented by someone who can explain them properly.


