

Hello again: The previous issue of this newsletter was dated September 8. As some of you know, I have been extremely busy putting together a book. It will be titled something like "Echoes of Conspiracy: The Hidden Dimensions of the JFK Assassination," by Peter Scott, myself, Russ Stetler, and Tink Thompson. It has been proceeding normally, with the normal unexpected delays. We don't have a definite production schedule at the moment, but we hope it will be published in a few months. Watch for it! I think it'll have something to interest everyone, and something for everyone to disagree with.

Current developments: By all accounts, not much is going on, especially in Washington. A letter from Rep. Fithian's office gives little encouragement on such matters as the future release of any HSCA material. No news on the acoustics has reached me.

I'm a bit more out of touch than usual - I've had time to read only the S.F. Chronicle, not even the NYT or the Post. Please send clippings; your contributions will be passed on to a small but (relatively) influential audience! And if you want to circulate your ideas on what we should be doing, let me know.

FBI files: The U.C. Berkeley library now has the original 100,000-page FBI release on microfilm. The film is pretty cumbersome to work with, but there are a few people here who might be able to help with specific research projects (especially if the approximate dates of the documents sought are known).

Indexes: Sylvia and Gary Owens have now sent me indexes to all 12 of the JFK volumes, plus the 2 volumes on Legislative and Administrative Reform (and, of course, the Report). I've tried to keep my interested correspondents supplied with the latest indexes, but if you are missing any, please ask for them. (Some indexes will be sent only on special request - Leg.-II, VII with both the medical and firearms parts together, and revised versions of II and XI.) Arrangements have been made for the publication of the indexes by Scarecrow Press, hopefully early next year.

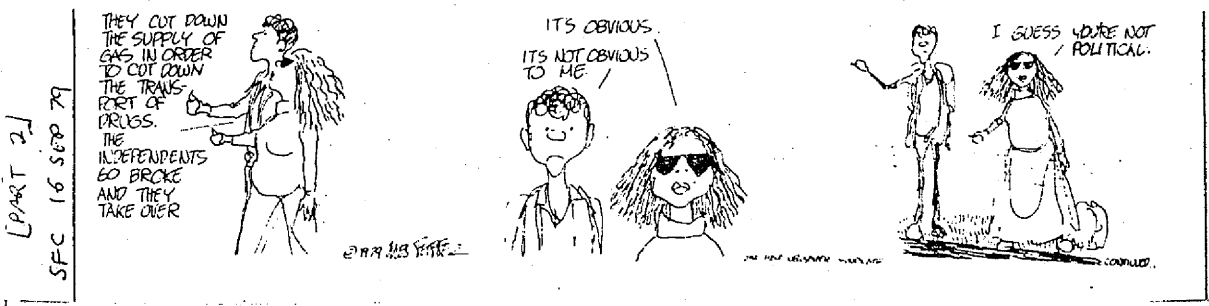
