A review was made of all editions of "The Dallas Morning News" and "The Dallas Times Herald" newspapers from microfilm maintained at the Dallas Public Library, Main Library, 1954 Commerce Street, for the period October 3, 1963, through November 22, 1963, and the following articles concerning former Vice President RICHARD M. NIXON's trip to Dallas on November 21, 1963, were located:

"The Dallas Morning News," early city edition, Section 4, Page 1, November 22, 1963, contains an article captioned, "NIXON PREDICTS JFK MAY DROP JOHNSON," by CARL FREUND. This article indicates that NIXON flew to Dallas, Thursday, November 21, 1963, for a meeting of Pepsi-Cola bottlers. His New York law firm represents the soft drink company. The article also indicates NIXON will leave Love Field two hours before President KENNEDY arrives.

"The Dallas Times Herald," final edition, Page 1, November 21, 1963, contains an article captioned, "NIXON HERE BEFORE JFK ON 'BUSINESS'," by BEN STEPHENS. This article indicates NIXON flew to Dallas on Wednesday night, November 20, 1963, on a "quick business trip" as an attorney for the soft drink firm his New York law partnership represents.

Other than the above, no articles were located indicating that NIXON made any other trip to Dallas during the period October 3, 1963 through November 22, 1963. According to the above article appearing in "The Dallas Morning News," NIXON was scheduled to depart Dallas on November 22, 1963, two hours before President KENNEDY arrived.
