

Confidential Informant Dallas T-1 furnished the following on December 2, 1963:

Dallas T-1 advised that on April 29, 1963, LEE H. OSWALD had, on April 12, 1963, initiated a claim for unemployment insurance at the Commerce Street Office of the Texas Employment Commission in Dallas, Texas, and the IB-1 Form filed on April 29, 1963, was a renewal of the claim filed in Texas.

Dallas T-1 stated that inasmuch as this case was an interstate case, an Interstate Supplementary Form, IB-10, was sent to Texas for the purpose of classifying OSWALD as to his classification assignment. He was classified in Group C, which means that it was questionable as to whether or not he would be employed soon because his work history indicated the likelihood of a continuing question as to his availability, his attachment to a particular area in the labor market, that he moved around a lot, had irregular employment.

Dallas T-1 stated that the monetary eligibility determination date was set as April 16, 1963, at which time, according to the Texas Employment Commission, he was ineligible for unemployment insurance which was later resolved by the submission of a Form IB-1, submitted to Texas dated April 29, 1963, and Form IB-14, which is a request for a re-determination of his eligibility. In Texas it was found that the question of eligibility arose because of an error in the transposition of numerals in OSWALD'S Social Security Number and he was then found to be eligible to receive \$33.00 weekly as unemployment insurance compensation.

The Form IB-1 is a card on which is recorded the weekly submission of claim for unemployment insurance by the claimant which indicates the date of the claim, the type of form executed, and the claim taker's initials which is as follows:

April 29, 1963

IB-14, handled by Confidential Informant, Dallas T-6.

May 7, 1963

IB-2 and IB-10, handled by Confidential Informant, Dallas T-6.

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signature against the Form IB-1 which contains the claimant's known signature. A date and the form executed is entered onto the IB-1 Form as well as the claimant identification booklet and the information contained on the Form IB-2, then questions five through ten inclusive is executed by the Claims Interviewer and forwarded to the libel state which, in OSWALD'S case, was Texas. The claimant then obtains a blank IB-2 Form which he executes before appearing the following week.

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
