

Mr. LEONARD CALVERLEY, Foreman, Camera Department, Jaggars-Chiles-Stovall, 522 Browder, advised he was the immediate supervisor of LEE HARVEY OSWALD during OSWALD's employment with this company. He stated OSWALD came as a trainee and his work consisted of making camera enlargements and reductions. He said it was obvious after a few weeks that OSWALD was not turning out good work although he was regular in his attendance at work. He said OSWALD did not seem to like to be shown how to do his work and in this respect impressed him as being rather rebellious. He said he never heard any actual statements made by OSWALD which would have shown that he was inclined to favor Russia or Communism but that he did recall OSWALD had in his possession some sort of literature pertaining to Russia on one or more occasions. He described OSWALD as a quiet type of individual who never talked of his family or what his past activities had been. He said he gained no knowledge of OSWALD's personal life but had heard that OSWALD had a Russian wife and one child. He said he believed OSWALD had no automobile and that there was no indication he had any income except from his employment with this company.

He stated he could not recall that OSWALD had ever indicated he had been in Russia. CALVERLEY said OSWALD "fouled up" the work which was assigned him constantly and that led to his termination. He said OSWALD did not seem angry about being terminated and had no cross words with him, CALVERLEY, as a result of it.
