R. L. ADAMS, Employer Interviewer, Texas Employment Commission (TEC), 6th Floor, 1025 Elm Street, residence telephone BR 6-7943, furnished the following information:

From the TEC record maintained on application card of LEE OSWALD, Social Security No. 433-54-3937, he can state that OSWALD called on October 8, 1963, in response to a telephone message of October 7, 1963, and was referred to the Solid State Milerrical Company to apply for a job as sales clerk at \$850 a month. He was not hired.

On October 9, 1963, he appeared at the office of TEC and was sent to Burton Dixie Company to apply for a job as a clerk-trainee at \$1.25 per hour. He was not hired.

ADAMS further stated the records reflect that he left a telephone message for OSWALD on October 15, 1963, which was returned on October 15, 1963, at which time OSWALD was referred to Trans-Texas for a job as a cargo handler at \$310 per month. He did not report to this employer since according to notations made by ADAMS on the card ADAMS learned at 10:30 a.m. on October 16, 1963, that OSWALD was working.

ADAMS stated that after examining a photograph of LEE OSWALD he vaguely recalls him but cannot identify OSWALD positively as being the individual whom he referred on the dates mentioned above. He stated he is interpreting the records from cryptictype notations appearing thereon and that while the dates are correct there may be some question as to whether the contacts were telephonic or personal.
