Dr. BEN PARKER, owner of radio station KBOP, Pleasanton, Texas, stated that one day between early and mid afternoon sometime between about October 8, 1963, and October 15, 1963, to his best recollection, a white man name not i wailed, age about mid 20s, with sandy hair, 5'7-8", of rather dirty appearance, came into radio station KBOP stating that he was driving through Pleasanton and would like to obtain employment with this station. Doctor PARKER had no employment to offer this individual and therefore did not obtain any further information about him. He said he did not say by automobile that this man may have had nor did he know whether he was accompanied by Doctor PARKER montioned that he had seen anyone else. television photographs of LEE WARVEY OSWALD and that he believed it was possible this individual who contacted him for employment may have been OSWALD. However, he said he had actually paid very little attention to the individual seeking employment and was not at all sure that they were the same and wiso that it was possible his own imagination has become overly active due to publicity concerning the assasination of the President.
