Immediately following the report that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had been shot at the Dallas Police Station on the morning of November 24, 1963, Special Agents CHARLES T. BROWN, JR.; CURTIS L. PERRYMAN, ARTHUR E. CARTER, LEO L. ROBERTSON and WALLACE R. HEITMAN proceeded to Parkland Memorial Hospital, Dallas, Texas, where immediate liaison was established in the operating corridor where OSWALD had been taken.

Such liaison was established with Doctor MAURY SOLTES and through him with Doctor TOM SHIRES, Professor of Medicine at the Southwestern Medical School and Chief of Surgery at Parkland Memorial Hospital, who was in the operating room and directing the emergency measures being taken on OSWALD.

Preparations were made to be ready to take a dying declaration from OSWALD and Special Agents BROWN and HEITMAN donned operating clothing and took positions outside the operating room in the event Doctor SHIRES gave the word from inside that OSWALD wished to talk.

Following the advice sent by Doctor SHIRES that OSWALD had died, this information was immediately communicated by open line to the Dallas FBI Office and the above-described liaison at Parkland Memorial Hospital was discontinued.
