On November 24, 1963, [redacted] Office of Security, Central-Intelligence Agency (CIA), furnished the Liaison Agent the following information.

At approximately 10 a.m., November 24, 1963, CIA Headquarters received a phone call from Valdo Ragash, 11389 Debora Drive, Cleveland 30, Ohio, Phone 884-6550. Ragash stated that subject and his wife were trained Soviet spies who had not yet completed their missions. Ragash stated that Mrs. Oswald should be carefully watched and that full protection should be afforded to Mrs. Kennedy. He further indicated that he might have some more information.

The above was furnished to the Secret Service November 24, 1963. Telephonical instructions were given to Special Agent A. J. Quill, Cleveland Office, to interview Ragash and sutel results to Bureau.

A review of Bufiles failed to disclose any information identifiable with Ragash.
