CHARLES GOOLSEY, Detective, Juvenile Bureau, Dallas, Texas, Police Department, home address 2911 Eisenhower, telephone FR 4-6707, was notified of the Agents' identities, and informed that he did not have to talk to Agents; that anything he said could possibly be used against him in a court of law; and that he had a right to consult an attorney. He related the following:

His usual hours on November 24, 1963, were from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. A short time after he reported for duty Chief STEVENSON instructed all the juvenile officers to stand by. At about 11:00 a.m., Captain MARTIN came in and ordered all of the juvenile officers to the basement. All the juvenile officers went to the basement. The officers who did so were Detectives GOOLSBY, LOWERY, CUTCHSHAW, MILLER and Patrolman HARRISON. After they got off the elevator they walked through the lobby in front of the jail office and were checked through by Patrolman NELSON who was stationed there. NELSON knew them all and they were not required to identify themselves. There were numerous officers and reporters standing around and after a few minutes Captain JONES announced that he did not want anyone to pass except reporters and officers. He told all the reporters to go across the hall into the garage area. A few minutes later Captain JONES ordered the juvenile Bureau group to move out into the area immediately outside the swinging doors leading to the jail lobby. He described the jail lobby as the corridor leading from the elevators to the swinging door. This hallway has two or three windows for the benefit of people who came to jail with prisoners and across the hallway were a couple of phone booths. GOOLSBY took up a position just outside the swinging doors to this corridor and opposite the door to the jail office that led to the basement parking area.

At about 11:15 a.m., or thereabouts, someone shouted, "Here they come," or something to that effect. Captain FRITZ came through the jail office door and he was followed by LEAVELLE was on OSWALD who was between two police officers. Detective left. Another officer was right and Detective GRAVES was on his through the door from the jail office, a group of reporters who were standing along the wall adjacent to the door surged
