The following investigation was conducted as a result of information received from ED BUCK, a lawyer, Sante Fe, New Mexico, to the effect that in April or May 1963, while attending Southern Methodist University, Dallas, Texas, (SMU) he was in the habit of eating his breakfast on Sunday mornings at Luby's Cafeteria, which is located directly across the street from the SMU Campus. He indicated that on one occasion, in either April or May 1963, a tall, slender man standing next to him at the steam table, struck up a conversation regarding Cuba, the general demeanor of which was that this man did not feel that the United States was being fair in its treatment of FIDEL CASTRO, and expressed a favorable attitude toward the CASTRO regime.

The unknown male claimed to have met a former Marine named OSWALD who had a Russian wife. The unknown male said OSWALD was taking a job in a book depository in Dallas where the unknown male had been working. The unknown male also stated that he, himself, was employed as a designer at the Bell Helicopter Plant, located between Dallas and Fort Worth, Texas.

Mr. BUCK described this man as a white male American, about 35 years of age, 6'2", 160 pounds, black hair, blue eyes, very slender build, and a long face.

Investigation conducted by the Albuquerque Office identified the unknown male as MICHAEL RALPH PAINE. The results of investigation conducted by the Albuquerque Office in connection with the above information are reflected in the report of SA STUART J. CAMERON, dated June 8, 1964, at Albuquerque, New Mexico, and the report of SA WILLIAM V. CURRAN, dated June 19, 1964, at Albuquerque, New Mexico.
