Dear Mr. Wolff;

Thank you for replying to my letter. I'm sorry that it required a second mailing for you to receive it.

Please don't misread the tone of my follow-up of 10/26. I did not intend discourtesy. I realized that having mailed the August 30 letter long before the date on which you indicated you would be arriving in Malaga there was a possibility that someone may have attempted to forward it to you and that it might have been lost enroute. On the other hand, not knowing what kind of arrangements you had made to receive mail, I could not be sure that the letter might not be waiting for you to arrive. I found myself in the awkward position of attempting to word my letter in such a way that it did not exclude either possibility. I think that perhaps you misread my effort to be diplomatic as intended discourtesy. My intention was the opposite.

I claim no expertise on the Washington Post, and I thank you for clarifying the situation that existed there.

Incidentally, I don't know whether you've ever had any correspondence with Bob Kaiser, but he indicated to me that he was quite pleased with your review of "RFK Must Die." I just thought I'd pass it on.

I appreciate the encouragement you offered in your last paragraph. I certainly will send you a tear sheet.
