Thank you very much for your most kind letter about my piece. I had caught some of the mistakes you mentioned when I was going over it all for a revised version, and I am grateful to you for mentioning the others. Even with your wonderful index, which I only came across quite recently, I still can't keep all of the material together. But your index certainly helps immensely. (Incidentally, I have been working for the last two weeks at the British Museum, and using their copy of the 26 volumes. As soon as I showed the librarian your index, he snatched it up, and rushed off to order it for the library.)

I would love to discuss various points with you about the case, especially those where our interpretations seem to differ a bit. Unfortunately I won't be back in America until about February 1st, but maybe we can meet sometime after that. In the spring I will be teaching on the East Coast, and will be in New York from time to time.

Thanks again for your kind words, and for all of the information and stimulating speculation in your letter.

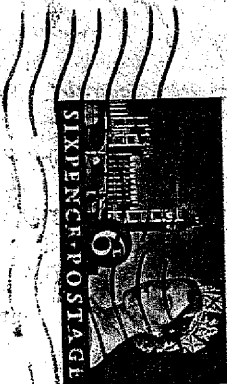
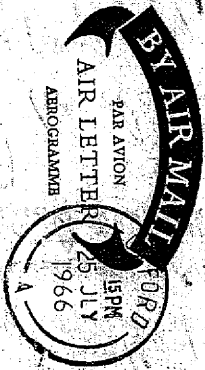
