

Pharmacist Says He Gave
F. B. I. a Tip on the Rifle

DAYTON, OHIO, Nov. 24 (UPI)—Duane Creviston, local pharmacist, said today that he had recognized the rifle used to kill President Kennedy as the same type he had seen in a catalogue advertisement and that he had then notified the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The pharmacist, whose hobby is collecting rifles, said that he had spotted the advertisement in a catalogue issued by Klein's Sporting Goods Company of Chicago.

Mr. Creviston said that he immediately recognized the rifle when he caught a glimpse of it on television Friday night.

He said that he understood his tip to the F.B.I. had led them to the source of the rifle. The local F.B.I. office refused to comment.
