RUBY IN RECORDING DENIES CONSPIRACY

Jack Ruby has recorded a statement that no conspiracy was involved in his killing of Lee Harvey Oswald, who was named by the Warren Commission as the assassin of President Kennedy.

Elmer Gertz, a member of Ruby's legal team, told the Associated Press in a telephone interview from Chicago last night that the recording had been made secretly in Parkland

inght that the recording had been made secretly in Parkland Memorial Hospital, Dallas, where Ruby is a cancer patient. He said Ruby's denial takes up three minutes of a 46-minute long-playing Capitol record called "The Assassination." The voices of other persons who played leading roles in the drama are also on the record. A spokesman for Capitol said the record would be played publicly for the first time at a news conference in New York today. Among others on the record are the late President, Gov. John B. Connally Jr. of Texas, Oswald and members of the Dallas police force.

Profits from the recording will go to the Kennedy Library in Cambridge, Mass., Mr. Gertz said.
