**Life to Release Today
Part of Kennedy Film**

Life magazine said yesterday it would release today four frames of an amateur movie of the Kennedy assassination.

The announcement followed a report in Newsweek magazine that Life technicians had accidentally destroyed frames 208, 209, 210 and 211 of a film taken by Abraham Zapruder, a Dallas manufacturer who had sold the film to Life.

Newsweek said in its Feb. 6 issue that its information had come from Wesley J. Liebeler, a Warren Commission staff member.

George Hunt, managing editor of Life, conceded yesterday that the frames had been destroyed.

He said, however, this had taken place after the F.B.I. viewed the film, after the magazine made its own copies and after the film was made available to the Warren Commission.
