## Poll Finds Most Doubt Warren Report Told All

As the debate continues, public doubts about the Warren Commission report on the assassination of President Kennedy persist. By a 59 to 30 per cent margin, Americans recently maintained that there was more to the story.

But in a survey taken shortly before reports of new evidence uncovered by Nav Orleans authorities, the p folic expressed resignation that the whole story would never be known and little would be gained by further inquiry.

By 2 to 1 the public wes against reopening the Warren Commission investigation.

Public certainty that Lee Harvey Oswald shot the President remained at 70 per cent. Those

who believed he did voted 44 to 35 per cent in favor of the theory that Oswald was part of a broader plot rather than acting on his own.
