

Tower, Goldwater Refuse To Sign Panel's Report

Two Republican members of the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence Activities refused yesterday to sign the panel's final report on foreign and military intelligence activities.

They were John G. Tower, Republican of Texas, the group's vice chairman, and Barry Goldwater of Arizona. Another Republican member, Howard H. Baker Jr. of Tennessee, objected to some of the findings but agreed to sign the report.

The other Republican members of the committee are Senators Charles McC. Mathias Jr. of Maryland and Richard S. Schweiker of Pennsylvania. Both signed the document.

The Democratic members of the panel were Senator Frank Church of Idaho, the chairman, and Philip A. Hart of Michigan, Walter F. Mondale of Minnesota, Walter Huddleston of Kentucky, Robert Morgan of North Carolina and Gary Hart of Colorado.
