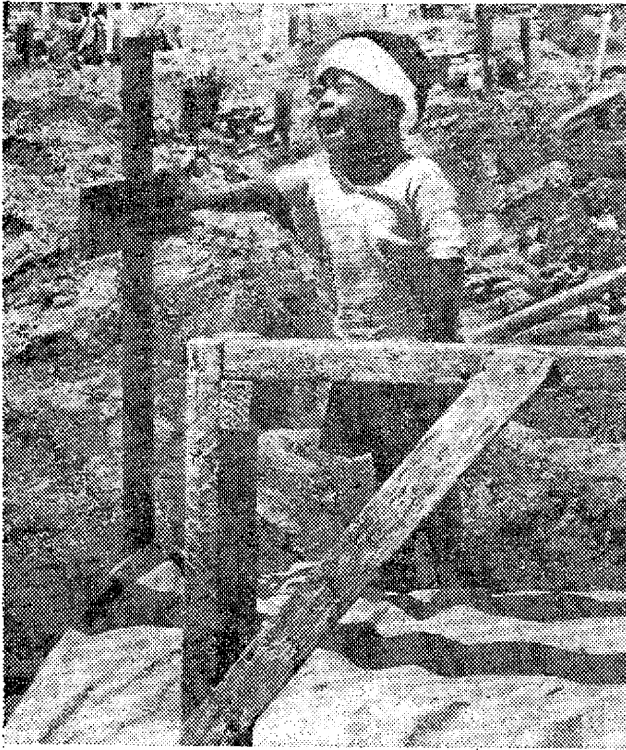


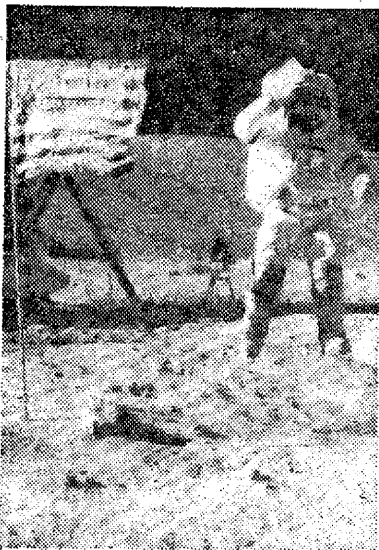
The Decade Since

In the late 1960s, campuses all over the nation began erupting with riots and violence as dissent against the war mounted.



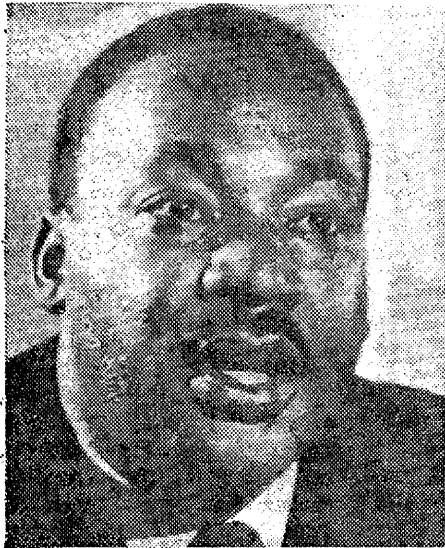
In 1969, in a program started by John F. Kennedy, two Americans walked on the moon.
