Oswald's Widow Summoned In Suits on His Possessions

DALLAS, Jan. 19 (UPI)—The Government subpojenaed today Mrs. Marina Oswald Porter to appear Jan. 31 in two suits involving the possessions of Lee Harvey Oswald, assassin of President Kennedy.

One suit, filed by Jack King of Denver, seeks \$5-million for the value of the rifle that killed President Kennedy Nov. 22, 1963, and the pistol that killed J. D. Tippit, the Dallas policeman, the same day.

Mrs. Porter's suit of \$500,000 is to recover the value of some 348 items, including her husband's diary, clothing, correspondence and other personal affects.

An assistant United States Attorney, Ken Mighell, said that Mrs. Ported had sold the rifle and pistol to Mr. King for an amount "in excess of \$25,-000." The Government seized the rifle after Congress passed the rifle after Congress passed a special statute that empowered the Attorney General to take all exhibits used in the Warren Commission investigation.
