(AP)—Students asked Senator
Kennedy today whether or not
he would, if elected, disclose
all materials—now stored in
United States archives—used
by the Warren Commission in
investigating the death of his

He said the archives would
be opened "at the appropriate
time" and that he stood by the
commission's findings that Lee
Harvey Oswald, acting alone,
shot President Kennedy.
