> A glaring discrepancy in the evidence, Joling said, arises from the Los Angeles County Medical Examiner's finding that "the shot that hit the senator above the right ear had to have been fired from no more than 1 to 3 inches away."

> But Richard Lubic, 37, a television producer who was next to the senator at the moment of the shooting, told The ENQUIRER:

> "Sirhan's hand when he fired was at least 3 to 4 feet away."

Joling said that the identity of the alleged second gunman at the assassination scene has now been pinpointed. "A security guard, hired for the night Kennedy was killed, was seen by witnesses with his gun

drawn at the time the shots were being fired," he revealed.

"This man worked for the Ace Guard Service of Van Nuys, Calif., and his gun was a .22-caliber pistol like Sirhan's."

Lubic said: "The guard's pistol was pointed at the floor, where Kennedy had fallen.
