Dear Ted,

Thank you very much for your letter of the 19th. I greatly appreciate the trouble you took in contacting Messrs. Allen and Scott.

I am surprised by Mr. Scott's statement that there are several other indices, including one published by the Government. When I saw his column, I made some inquiries to see if I was mistaken in my impression that my index was the only one published. I could find no trace of any other index, certainly not one published by a commercial house as the column stipulated. The point of the Allen/Scott column was that the CIA had used a publishing company as a "front" in producing an index which was being used by researchers, etc., who were not aware of its paternity.

Still, I will write to Mr. Scott, as you suggested. Unfortunately, the Subject Index is now out of print and I simply don't have a copy to send him. The publishers have decided not to issue a second edition but another house is considering the possibility of printing a revised edition.

I am glad that you talked to Dick Sprague, who seems to be doing some valuable work in tracking down hitherto-unknown films and photographs.

Thanks for sending me the press release with your speech of Thursday the 13th. The press coverage was woefully inadequate. Has there been much response in the House?
