Dear Mr. Welsh,

I wish to thank you for your courtesy in returning my manuscript by airmail. It arrived safely yesterday, apparently crossing in the mails with my letter of 3 May 1966. You will have had that letter by now and will have noted that I requested also the return of my review of the book The Two Assassins, by Dr. Renatus Hartogs and Lucy Freeman, which I had submitted to you about a month ago. That review has been accepted for publication by another periodical.

One item which I had forgotten completely until I suddenly remembered it this morning is a parody of the "Rumors and Speculations" appendix in the Warren Report, which I believe I titled "Bloomers and Fabrications," and which consists of pairs of excerpts from the Report and then from the testimony or the documents, the latter colliding squarely with the former. I sent that to you some months ago, perhaps in February. Perhaps you will be good enough to return that piece too.

In my letter earlier this week I raised the question of photocopies which RAMPARTS may have made of my manuscript on the basis of a telephone conversation in January 1966, indicating that I was withdrawing any implied or explicit consent to such photocopying. In going through the manuscript after it arrived yesterday, I found a slip of white paper between the pages, in about the middle of the manuscript, with writing in a large hand in bright blue ink. The slip of paper seems to indicate that photocopies of my manuscript were made at some time while it was in RAMPARTS' possession.

I should be grateful if you would clarify that point. The slip of paper contains the handwritten words, "done copies." Thank you again.
