Dear Mr Bach,

On Saturday night I participated in a radio panel discussion of the Warren Report on WOR, and Randi's office has suggested that I should contact you in the event that you should decide to treat the same subject on your November 27th broadcast. Let me say at the outset that I do not have in mind appearing on the program—I am not possessed of the aesthetic attributes or the nervous system. However, I should like to be of help, if I could, in the hope that the most forceful impact possible could be made on the complacent public mind in calling attention to the inadequacies and defects in the Warren Report.

If you have the opportunity to hear the tape of the WOR program of Saturday midnight, you will find that some of the participants are very well-informed and articulate. Another expert on the case, and I am taking the liberty of mentioning his name without his knowledge, is Leo Sauvage—correspondent for Le Figaro and author of the book "L'Affaire Oswald" which was published in France early this year. He has been a guest on television programs such as Open Mind and Open End and would be an excellent choice, if you contemplate using guests.

I would be glad to make my own documentation available to you, if you think it would be useful. I have compiled a subject index to the testimony and documents published by the Warren Commission, which is to be issued early next year by Scarecrow Press, and I am working on a comparative analysis pointing to the discrepancies between the Warren Report and the actual testimony or documents on which it purports to be based. I have written some 250 pages thus far and would be willing to make the manuscript, or parts of it, available on loan as source material for your program.

Also, other researchers with whom I am in touch have developed some extraordinary photographic material challenging the official conclusions. It is my impression that they would consider it premature to release their findings at this time; but if you wish, I could put you in touch with them and you could discuss the prospects directly.

Please do not hesitate to call on me if I can be of any service other than participation in the program, as my one interest is that of public awakening and recognition of the need for reinvestigation of the terrible events in Dallas.
