Mr. WALKER BOREN, Route 1, Kempner, Texas, advised that he had possessed a Japanese rifle mounted with a K-4 Weaver scope which he traded to BUD MOORE of Bud's Gun Shop, 203 North Eighth Street, Killeen, Texas, on November 15, 1963. Mr. BOREN stated that he recalled that he had been in Moore's Gun Shop at about 9:00 a.m. on November 15, 1963, and that he further entered into a discussion with MOORE concerning the mounted scope on the Japanese rifle which he contended was off center and as a result had been ineffective for accurate shooting.

Mr. BOREN exhibited the Springfield M1603 30.06 rifle bearing serial number 3097818 and maintains that the weapon had been unused since its purchase but that he had purchased the weapon on a trade of his Japanese rifle for the express purpose of deer hunting this season.

Mr. BOREN further advised that he had been into Killeen, Texas, on November 22, 1963, to visit briefly with MOORE at MOORE's gun shop, but had returned to his home shortly before noon and had spent the balance of the day in and around his home and ranch property doing work. He stated he initially heard the information concerning President JOHN F. KENNEDY's assassination at Dallas, by radio and that much of the day was spent at his home following the progress reports of the investigation and the events surrounding the President's assassination.

Mr. BOREN advised that he was born March 4, 1915, in Copperas Cove, Texas, and is described as follows:
