Thank you for your letter of May 20. I am glad to hear that you still maintain your enthusiasm for my book. I've begun the process of revision, largely according to the guideline's of Thompson's "Reader's Report." I'll discuss this with you in detail when we next see each other. One of the additions I must make is the Lattimer affair, although a lengthy discussion will not be necessary to discredit that fake and to establish how he, in turn, has further discredited the official medical evidence. I've some things on that which I'm sure will just tickle you. Jerry has sent me your Texas Observer article, which is good but ^{is} written and framed differently than I might have expected or might have done myself.

I very much appreciate your invitation to your Fire Island house, and I would be delighted to come out and spend some time there with you. I'm sure we could talk endlessly, and not necessarily on the assassination alone. My brief meeting with you which was not very fulfilling because of the unavoidable presence of "third parties" indicated to me that you are rich in a variety of subjects which greatly interest me.

There is really no chance that I'll be in New York before mid-July. We can make arrangements after you have moved into your summer home and are settled. I look forward to getting together.
