New Demands Seen for Probe Of Assassination

LOS ANGELES, Calif. (UPI) —The senior counsel to the Warren Commission said Tuesday the death of Jack Ruby would probably bring fresh demands to reopen the investigation into the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Joseph A. Ball said at a news conference that the death of the night club owner who killed presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald should have no effect upon the status of the investigation of Kennedy's death, which is officially closed.

"There shouldn't be another investigation unless further information is divulged," said Ball, who was in Los Angeles to address a town hall civic forum.

However, he said the death of Ruby in Dallas would likely revive demands for another blue-ribbon inquiry into the assassination.
