# Senator Says Warren Panel Not Perfect

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP)—Sen. John Sherman Cooper, R-Ky., said the Warren Commission failed to study evidence he termed "significant" in connection with the assassination of President Kennedy.

The senator, a member of the commission that reported on the assassination, said its findings were "valid" and "correct" but the investigation could have been in more detail.

The evidence Cooper referred to was a set of X-rays and color photographs of the President's body taken during an autopsy at Bethesda Naval Hospital near Washington, a few hours after the assassination.

Cooper also said that all eyewitnesses to the assassination were not called to testify.

Despite criticism of the commission and its report, Cooper said yesterday he does not think it would be helpful to reopen the investigation.
