Jewish Services Planned for Ruby

CHICAGO, Jan. 6 (UPI).—Graves of his mother and Jack Ruby, the man who killed father, President John F. Kennedy's assassin before the eyes of 40 million was to be buried today in the faith his parents, Jewish immigrants, brought from Poland.

Rabbi David Graubart, who did not personally know Ruby but is a friend of his family, planned a traditional conservative Jewish service—"a sacred service consecrated to the memory of Jack Ruby," he said in a prepared eulogy.

"The eyes of the world are now upon us. Jack Ruby will soon be laid to rest. What is the verdict of history?" the rabbi asked.

Ruby, who was born Jack Rubenstein, was to be buried in a bronze white-gray coffin on the family plot near the graves of his mother and father.

The services at the funeral chapel where the body was viewed yesterday by Ruby's family and newsmen—to dispel any doubts that it was Jack Ruby—were closed to the public.

Following the 15-minute services the coffin, draped with the U.S. flag since Ruby served honorably in the Air Corps during World War II but did not go overseas, was to be accompanied by the family on an eight-mile ride to Westlawn Cemetery.

There on the plot marked by twin pine trees, Ruby's three brothers—Earl, Sam and Hyman—were to chant the Kaddish, a traditional prayer of mourning. The prayer usually is said by the son or sons of the deceased.
