MOVE FOR RUBY FAILS

**Court Refuses to Interfere in
Sanity Hearing**

Washington (AP)—Justice Hugo L. Black of the Supreme court refused yesterday to stay a sanity hearing for Jack Ruby, convicted of killing Harvey Lee Oswald, named by the Warren commission as the assassin of President John F. Kennedy. The hearing is scheduled for June 13 in criminal court in Dallas, Tex. Ruby is under sentence to death.

Black issued a brief order of denial in which he said:

"I do not feel justified in granting a stay which will interfere with the orderly and customary processes of the courts of Texas in attempts to give Ruby a fair and prompt determination of his rights."

William M. Kunstler, the New York attorney for Ruby, has asked that the sanity hearing be deferred until a formal appeal in the Ruby case is filed later in the Supreme court.
