Among spectators as the proceedings began was Mrs. Margeurite Oswald of Fort Worth, mother of Lee Harvey Oswald, the man Ruby was convicted of killing.

Judge Holland ordered photographers to take no pictures of Ruby either in the courtroom or in the hallways when he is finally brought into court. The judge said he acted to guard against what he called 'a circus atmosphere.'

The sanity hearing-first requested and then opposed by defense lawyers-is to determine Ruby's present mental state.
