**JACK RUBY'S MAIN
APPEAL SET FOR
HEARING JUNE 24**

Austin, Tex., June 15 (AP) — The Texas Court of Criminal Appeals said today that it will hear arguments June 24 on the main appeal to the death sentence imposed on Jack Ruby for killing Lee Harvey Oswald.

Setting of the date cleared the way, at least in state courts, for the first review by higher courts of the March 14, 1964, conviction by a District court jury in Dallas.

Ruby, 55, was sentenced for the Nov. 24, 1963 slaying of Oswald, who was accused by the Warren commission of having assassinated President Kennedy in Dallas two days earlier. Legal complications and wrangles among defense attorneys postponed action on the main appeal.
