

Elayton Fowler, attny Jack Ruby, 7/18/64

Fowler ...I understand previously when Mr Warren was here, that he was allowed to talk with Jack Ruby by himself and without the presence of anyone from the sheriff's department, which further leads me to believe that this (i.e., the presence of Sheriff's officers during Ruby's polygraph test) is not for security purposes only, and we will object to the presence of anyone from the Dallas County Sheriff's office.

Specter ...With respect to the conversations between the Chief Justice and Mr Ruby, I was present at the time those conversations were held and they were held in the corner of the room in which we ~~announcements~~ are now sitting, following the formal testimony of Mr Ruby...so that at no time was the Chief Justice alone with Mr Ruby in any separate room... On question No. 2, Mr Ruby did show a significant drop in the relative blood pressure. This question pertained to: "Did you go to the Dallas police station at any time on Friday November 22, 1963, before you went to the synagogue?" I asked him about this question later when he responded "No," and I noticed a physiological change...Due to the nature of this change, however, it is possible that it was caused by a body motion that I failed to detect during the actual response.
