The following investigation was conducted by SA A. RAYMOND SWITZER:

On June 8, 1964, WYMAN BARR, Owner, Glendale Camera Shop, 4448 South Marsalis, Dallas, Texas, was contacted at his place of business and exhibited a black and white, 5" x 8", photograph, which depicts the Presidential car carrying President JOHN F. KENNEDY and party. This photograph also depicts a group of spectators and, in the upper left-hand corner, is an individual who allegedly resembles JACK RUBY. This photograph was made available to the FBI by Mrs. FRANCES HAYS on June 1, 1964. BARR stated he had made copies of this photograph for JOHN ROE, an employee of Reliable Battery Company, Dallas, Texas. BARR stated ROE also works part time as a photographer.

BARR related that, as he recalled it, ROE did not take this photograph, but obtained it from someone at the concession stand in the Greyhound Bus Terminal, Dallas, Texas, who wanted prints made so he could sell them at the concession stand.

BARR stated he does not know the identity of the person who took this photograph.

On June 8, 1964, OWEN RAY ROE, also known as "Johnnie," Salesman, Reliable Battery Company, 2600 West Mockingbird Lane, Dallas, Texas, advised he resides at 2631 Joneshore Street, Dallas, Texas. He stated he is also self-employed as a photographer. ROE advised he was born July 17, 1932, at Dallas, Texas.

ROE advised that, several weeks following the assassination of President KENNEDY, he was contacted by the manager, name unrecalled, of the Greyhound Post House, Greyhound Bus Terminal, Dallas, Texas, who requested he make one-hundred copies, 5" x 8" size, of the above-described photograph depicting the Presidential car carrying President JOHN F. KENNEDY. ROE stated this individual informed him that he planned to sell these photographs at the concession stand at the Greyhound Bus Terminal, Dallas, Texas. ROE



advised it is his understanding this individual did not take the photograph himself, but had purchased it from someone else. He said he had no information as to who might have taken the photograph.

On June 9, 1964, CHARLES GOULD, Manager of the newsstand and Greyhound Post House, Inc., 203 South Lamar Street, Dallas, Texas, advised he resides at 3116 Hall Street, Dallas, Texas.

GOULD was exhibited the above-described 5" x 8" photograph of the Presidential car bearing President KENNEDY and party. This photograph also depicts some spectators and part of a building. In the upper left-hand corner of this photograph appears an individual who resembles JACK RUBY. GOULD advised that, about two weeks following the assassination of President KENNEDY, a Negro stopped in his office and was selling some 8" x 10", black and white, photographs of the same picture. He said this individual informed him he was a Deacon in some church in Dallas and any profit he realized from the sale of this picture would be given to his church. GOULD said he bought one of these photographs. Shortly thereafter, since photographs of President KENNEDY were in demand, GOULD stated he contacted "JOHNNIE" ROE, a photographer, and had one-hundred prints, size 5" x 8", made from the photograph he had purchased. He said he sold these photographs for 98¢ each at the newsstand in the Greyhound Bus Terminal.

GOULD stated he does not know the identity of the individual who took the above photograph but, since he is very familiar with the downtown area of Dallas, the background of this photograph depicts a portion of the First National Bank Building, which is located in downtown Dallas on Main Street, between Akard and Field Streets. He said the person taking the photograph must have been on the south side of Main Street across from the First National Bank Building.



Special Agent MANNING C. CLEMENTS, of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, interviewed JACK RUBY over a period of some three and one-half hours on December 21, 1963, and saw RUBY during his trial in Dallas, Texas. SA CLEMENTS viewed the above photograph on June 9, 1964, and advised this photograph does not, in his opinion, include anyone closely resembling JACK RUBY.

It is to be noted the First National Bank Building is located approximately nine blocks from the site of the Presidential assassination, which occurred at approximately 12:30 PM, on November 22, 1963.

It is further noted that previous investigation as reported in case captioned, "JACK L. RUBY; LEE HARVEY OSWALD (Deceased) - VICTIM, CIVIL RIGHTS," reveals the following employees of the "Dallas Morning News," interviewed December 4, 1963, have asserted that JACK RUBY was present in the advertising office of that newspaper from at least 12:00 Noon to 1:30 PM, November 22, 1963, and that JACK RUBY could not, therefore, have observed the Presidential motorcade as it passed the corner of Elm and Houston Streets:

GEORGIA MAYOR, Secretary, Advertising Division, "Dallas Morning News," corner Young and Houston Streets, Dallas (observed RUBY 12:30 PM, November 22, 1963);

DON J. CAMPBELL, Advertising Salesman (observed RUBY from 12:00 Noon to 12:25 PM, November 22, 1963);

BILLIE A. RAY, Advertising Salesman (observed RUBY from 12:40 PM to 1:30 PM, November 22, 1963).
