We saw Fred J. Cook. He is essentially convinced that this was a warfare state assassination. His interest in the assassination is intense, but he cannot work on the matter unless he receives money. Have you got any ideas of where he can get an advance to write on this matter?

Vacation plans? We will remain close to the City throughout the summer. I will try to get to New Hampshire for a weekend to speak to Carl Oglesby of SDS about the assassination. We have had a long telephone conversation. He is beginning to study the matter.

Sylvia, I guess you have read Popkin's piece in the New York Review of Books. It is very fine. I wish he had said that Oswald was innocent. But how this man has worked and how well he learned.
