

NOTES FROM BOSTON- PREPARED DECEMBER 1, 1966

After the discussion, Seven Judges, No Jury, Wednesday, November 30, 8 p.m. to 10:30 p.m., at the Charles Street Meeting House, Mt. Vernon at Charles Street, Boston, Mass., I was approached by Ed Epstein. I first saw him when he greeted me, looking up from the floor level towards me on the podium.

"What are you doing in Boston?" he asked.

"I am telling the truth to the people. What are you doing?"

He then came up to the podium and extended his hand.

I asked, "What are you up to?"

He said, "I've changed, Vince." He was with someone, a young man about his age.
