Dear Mr. Savage,

I was unable to reach you  
on the telephone last night  
so I send this note.

Ed Epstein called me from  
Cambridge last night (he has  
returned to Harvard to stay)  
and mentioned that he has  
seen your English edition.

He regretted a statement  
in your new chapter to the  
effect that Salandria was the  
first to discover the FBI  
Summary Report of Dec. 9, 1963  
and asked me to mention  
the following facts to you,  
in case it is still possible

to make changes in your book.  
Epstein was the first person  
to discover both the FBI  
Report of Dec. 9, 1963 and  
the report of January 13, 1964.  
That is a matter of record at  
Cornell University, Ithaca, N.Y.  
It was Epstein's reference to  
the FBI reports in  
correspondence with a third  
person that, indirectly,  
influenced Alexandria to  
search for the documents in  
the Archives. He was  
successful in discovering  
the Dec. 9 FBI report  
and he was the first  
writer to publish an excerpt  
from that Dec. 9 FBI report.

However, Epstein was the first to publish the FBI January 13, 1964 Report. Neither Salandria nor any other writer even knew about the January 13, 1964 report until Inquest was published.

Therefore, if possible, Epstein hopes you can change the statement that Salandria discovered the FBI report of Dec. 9, 1963, to say that Salandria was the first to publish a reference to its contents.

Thank you, by the way, for your kind references to me in your book, which Epstein mentioned also. Sylvia Meagher
