Dear Mr Daub,

I was disappointed to learn when I phoned this morning that the Index has not yet arrived; but I suppose it will be here any day now. As I have mentioned before, Leo Sauvage (author of "L'Affaire Oswald" and many articles and other works), American correspondent for Le Figaro, intends to do a review of my Index. He phoned me over the weekend to inquire when it will be out, as I had suggested that it was due on the 21st of this month.

Therefore, I should like to confirm my telephone request of this morning to your secretary--that as soon as the copies arrive, please send one of my ten copies to Mr. Leo Sauvage, 270 West End Avenue, NYC, by first-class mail.
